Year 5 Grammar and Punctuation Glossary



This glossary builds on the terminology used in previous years.

Grammar/Punctuation term	What does it mean!
Relative clauses	Relative clauses add information to a sentence using the relative pronouns who, whom, whose, that and which. e.g The principal, who hated chaos, felt calm.
Modal verbs	Modal verbs indicate possibility, obligation or ability. e.g will, would, should, could, may, can, shall, ought to, must, might
Adverbials of time	Adverbials of time are used to say when something happened, for how long or for how often. <i>e.g</i> <u>Yesterday</u> , I went to the beach with my friends.
Brackets and dashes	Brackets and dashes are used to interrupt the normal run of a sentence and insert additional information. e.g. The driver bought a new watch. (His old one had stopped working).
Relative pronoun	Relative pronouns are pronouns that link one part of a sentence to another by introducing a relative clause. <i>E.g who, whom, whose, which, that, what.</i>
Ambiguity	Ambiguity is the presence of two or more possible meanings.
