Reading Focus

We now have a small band of Reading Champions ready to support children with their reading through the school. Many thanks to those giving up their time for this vital service, and please feel free to keep volunteering if at any point you find yourself in a position to offer some help! We make no apology for continuing to promote the importance of children reading, both at home and at school, as we feel very passionately



that this is such a vital skill and families have so much to offer in supporting children in this. Even older children, who you may feel are excellent readers, benefit from the opportunity to discuss language and explain their understanding of the things they read.

We are trying to encourage children to record their home reading in their reading record books, which all children have in their book bags. This could be families writing when they hear children, but can also be children recording for themselves. We would really appreciate your support in this and feel it will encourage children to value time spent reading and promote that love of reading which is at the heart of successful learning.

If you need a **book bag** for your child (they are really brilliant for encouraging children to be organised and for keeping things safe!) you can order them on "**Mapac**", where you order the school uniform.

Read Write Inc. Reading Books

To support the teaching of phonics in Read Write Inc the school has purchased phonic reading books that all children in the scheme (mainly Reception and Year 1) will bring home on a Monday after school. These books will be **IN ADDITION TO** their normal banded reading book, which means your child may have one colour book for the normal banded books and a different colour for their Read Write Inc group.

It would be very helpful therefore if all children could have their book bags in school, so that in their lesson on a Monday they can change RWI books for the next title teachers want them to read at home. It may take us a few weeks to settle into the routine, but hopefully we will all have it sorted soon and then we will see the benefit of the extra phonic practise in the children's reading and writing.


Farming Roadshow
