School Improvement

Last week, we were visited by our two academy improvement officers to support us in monitoring progress towards our school improvement priorities. During the visit they looked at books, watched lessons, carried out learning walks and spoke to pupils and staff in a similar way to an Ofsted. We have now received the report and are very pleased with how positive it is. The school is improving in its provision for pupils and outcomes for pupils' learning in all areas. Our targets are to continue to do this and in particular to ensure marking focuses on spelling, handwriting and punctuation so that pupils can correct basic errors to meet their age group expectations.

Curriculum enrichment

After half term, we will be adding to our curriculum enrichment activities with rugby lessons from the Cornish Pirates, badminton coaching and a visiting artist as well as trips, well-being days, St Piran's parade and more.

Collective Worship

This week the children learnt all about Candlemas – they even had to do some maths in collective worship working out the length of time between Christian celebrations and special days. In Open the Book the children heard the story 'A time to build'. This encouraged the children to think about giving people a second chance.

To kick start the project, we took part in an online event with a Mechatronic Engineer from Gaist Solutions, Jenny Roberts, who told us live via the internet: "I am an Engineer – this is what I do!" The children thoroughly enjoyed the session – especially being able to ask the engineer questions about her exciting job.

Holiday Science Challenge - Let it rain

If you wish to take part in this term's science challenge, then you will need to brush up on your knowledge of the water cycle. Your challenge is to produce a poster, PowerPoint or a 3D model of the water cycle. We would love to hear some key facts about this process with a focus on how temperature affects the rate of evaporation. This challenge is optional - a certificate will be awarded for the most inventive and creative designs from each year group and key stage. We are looking forward to seeing your creations.
