







<u>Curriculum Focus Times Tables – Skills for Life</u>

As you are all aware, learning times tables remains a really high priority across all primary schools, especially with the expectation that children will know all tables by the end of



Year Four. This is a very challenging target for many of our children and to achieve it we need an active, positive partnership between school and home, offering frequent and varied tables practice opportunities.

There are many ways you can <u>encourage your children at home</u>: quick fire challenges; written practice; card games; real life opportunities; Times Tables Rockstars; other on line interactive multiplication games; tables grids; timed challenges etc.

"Many educators don't dispute the fact that knowing times tables is a 'good thing'.

Interactive online activities are already popular in maths classes, and have proven an engaging tool for children to develop fluency in applying their maths knowledge. Regularly including online times tables activities in lessons and at home is one way to ensure that children practise the skills needed in a low stakes environment.

For depth of learning, it is also important that children are given the opportunity to see, explore, and understand the mathematical structures and patterns that lie beneath. Really knowing and being able to apply these facts (and their inverse - up to 12x12) means that working memory is freed up, leaving space to process and think more about new mathematical ideas. With this in mind, offering a range of activities and contexts to support practice and application of pupils' growing knowledge of times table facts is crucial.

Learning opportunities that draw on real-life scenarios, combined with those that utilise interactive and online activities, really encourage the development of fluency and support every child on their journey to

truly 'knowing' times table facts."

Revised Times for Classes to Enter and Leave School

<u>Thank you for all your support</u> with our morning and afternoon arrangements. You have all been so efficient and helpful with your efforts to move around the school safely and in accordance with social distancing protocol that we feel able to reduce the times between classes even further, which will hopefully make life easier for all, but especially for families with two or more children.



Times:

Reception/Year 3/Year 6 – start at 8:45am and leave at 3:05pm Year 1 and Year 4 – start at 8:50am ad leave at 3:10pm Year 2 and Year 5 – start at 8:55am and leave at 3:15pm Nursery – start at 9:00am and leave at 3:00pm

Please <u>try to arrive at you allotted time</u>. If you are early, can we ask that you do not come up to the gates until your time so that parents and children for earlier slots can get through.

Only **ONE parent** should enter the school site to drop and collect.

Please keep the car park clear at all times for exiting parents - I'm afraid children cannot play or congregate here. This includes our year 6s, who if walking should be exiting the site as soon as released.

Please remember the <u>'rule of 6'</u> - this includes all children and families even on the school run.

Please try <u>to observe the social distancing rules</u> and respect others' space when queuing. We have provided labels along the pathways to help you achieve this.

As time goes on it can be easy to become a little complacent about the rules in place, but it is essential we maintain strict observance if we are to continue to protect our own and others' safety through the Covid pandemic.

For your information:

We have been informed of a coming road closure whilst Wales and West Utilities complete some essential works.


Wales and West Utilities will be carrying out the gas works to reinforce the network in the area to secure the future gas supply.

The section affected by the closure is at the top of Moorland Road (see attached photo, shown by the dotted line).

The 57.3m section will be closed from Saturday 14 to Wednesday 18 November.

From 19 to 25 November 2 way lights will be in place.

This close to our school and as regularly used at drop off and pick up times on the school run this may cause some added congestion.
