Timetable

Morning

9.00 –9.30 am - **class CW** quiet music candles stimulus images/activity Bible verse openended questions record children's thoughts as mind map.

9.30 - break - **Bible Focus=** *Window Encounter* follow up the Bible quote used in CW. Younger may just interpret simplistically older may explore the emotions /implications (musical interpretation/ poetry /drama/dance/diary or letter as character). Build in quiet time to reflect on thoughts. At end *Mirror Reflection* record what have you learnt about self/others/world/God?

After break—Lunch— World Focus = Window encounter— put the Bible passage in the context of the wider world. Explore the diversity of communities and environments. Encourage children to think about their own importance in the world and the different ways they can show stewardship of the world: praying; recycling; altering habits to use less plastic; not littering; support campaigns to protect environments and wildlife; support charities that help those in need around the world; learn about the lives of people in different places; look after those in need in our own community; look after our own surroundings at home school. (Drama/dance/writing diaries, poems, news reports/ debates/music/prayers) Build in quiet time. At end use the writing frames provided to record:

Mirror Reflection record what have you learnt about self/others/world/God. **Door transformation** = creative response/prayer/poem etc.

<u>Afternoon</u> <u>Door transformation</u>

Expression feelings/ideas through art medium (eg. clay/collage/drawing/ printing/ painting/ pastels/charcoal/digital images/if weather permits natural sculptures in grounds).

Practical responses eg gardening; creating posters for quiet garden /wildlife garden;

2.45pm - **class CW** as at beginning. Quiet music candles silence to think about the day/think others/think about God. *Reflection* Questions about what they have learnt About themselves/ each other/ the world/ God. Talk to person next to them if want to. Record thoughts to mindmap from am.
