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<p>Year 4</p> 	<p>Lesson 4</p> <p><b><u><a href="#">The Key to Keywords</a></u></b></p> <p>Pupils learn strategies to increase the accuracy of their keyword searches and make inferences about the effectiveness of the strategies.</p>	<p><b><u><a href="#">Finding and Identifying Appropriate Online Content</a></u></b></p> <p>Cybersmart teaching resource from Australia exploring search techniques</p>	<p><b>ICT:</b> Finding information - Pupils should be able to: consider the online information needed to solve a problem, complete a task or answer a question, and explore how information will be used</p> <p><b>Literacy:</b> consider what the reader needs to know and include relevant details adapt style and language appropriately for a range of forms, purposes and readers</p> <p><b>Idea:</b> Produce online Trivia Quiz, to be published on school website, or school blog, <b>with a guide alongside to good searching, to help users find answers quickly.</b> The guide pupils produce should be based on the knowledge learned from the unit.</p> <p>Set trivia questions based on school learning, topics and current music. Use variety of media links for the answers. Pupils could use simple PowerPoint with hyperlinks, or create using wikis or blogs, with hyperlinks to correct pages and answers.</p>

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
