Dear Parents,

School Improvement

Parents Evenings – we have begun to trial longer parents' meetings. We are seeking feedback to see if these are appreciated and useful and then will look to adapt our programme accordingly.

Parent Questionnaires – the results have been collated and we were really pleased with how positive feedback has been. One of the areas parents have fed back to us is about clubs. This is always a challenge to the school in terms of funding but we are looking in to increasing the options available for paid clubs run by external providers such as the current Argyle Football Club. The after-school child care provision requested will run as a trial in the summer term. This will be run in the same way as Breakfast club with a booking/payment set-up on School Money. The club will run from 3.15-4.15 and cost £2. Where parents expressed specific concerns, we have tried to see parents individually but if you feel that you have any concerns, questions etc that are not resolved through parents' meetings, please do pop in to see the class teacher of myself. Feedback about school communication especially Class Dojo was very positive and we will aim to increase consistency with this over the summer term.

Curriculum enrichment

Last week was Science Week – the children had an amazing couple of days taking part in whole school events – science experiments but also Health awareness workshops run by a range of professionals. A huge thank you goes to those who gave up their time and to Mrs Roberts who organised the whole event. We all learnt a lot about being healthy last week!

Collective Worship

Last week, the children were thoroughly inspired by Open the Book's Wednesday collective Worship – the retelling of Peter's Miraculous Fish Catch – a brilliant performance which gave the children lots to think about. This week the focus was on Change and making amends. The children have also begun to record their thoughts about Collective Worship in a school floor book. This helps us refer back to what we have learnt.
