School Improvement

Last week we had our Ofsted inspection. Once the report is received, usually about 2 weeks, we will be able to share the inspectors' findings. Many thanks to all the parents who were able to add their views through Parent View. We were very proud of the children who represented St Catherine's very well in their interactions with the team.

This term we have had training as a staff on outdoor learning and will be having an outdoor learning week later in May. We have also been focusing on writing still and in the children's books our marking is focusing on ensuring the basics – handwriting, spelling and punctuation are correct for age related expectations – a crucial part in children achieving at the end of each key stage. This has had good impact on raising standards of children's writing – they are using the feedback to edit and improve their work also.

Curriculum enrichment

Year 2 have been to visit Kernow House and have really enjoyed meeting the residents there this week.

Reception Class have had a great time in Forest School this week.

Year 1 and 2 had fun outside learning all about growing as they began to plant up lots of different seeds such as sunflowers and grass.

Year 5 and 6 swimming has begun to help everyone achieve a good level of swimming and water safety before they leave St Catherine's.

Year 4 and Reception have booked their trip to Eden Project for the end of term.

This week the children in yr1 and 2 had a special assembly about the cricket they will be learning from their new coach. KS2 had a visit from local lifeguards to talk about Beach Safety.

Outdoor learning week is happening in the last week of term – this will include a well-being day on the Monday.

Collective Worship

This term our collective worship has a global theme. So far the children have learnt about countries that struggle to have enough clean, water. They heard about the charity Water Aid and what they do. They have then found out about food and reflecting on the need to share food around the world. They have heard about the baptism of Jesus and Jesus calming the storm in an exciting presentation (where the children played the part of the storm) in Open the Book.
