



Dear Parents, School Improvement

We are currently redesigning our curriculum to start in September. The aim of this is to ensure that our children have a broad curriculum with a deep level of knowledge and understanding by the time they reach year 6. This new approach will incorporate the work we have done of the seven capabilities this year – Managing feelings, confidence and agency, resilience and determination, creativity, planning and problem solving, relationships and leadership and communication. We will also be creating subject knowledge organisers and vocabulary maps which the children can use independently to learn. We will continue to ensure the children have access to a wide range of enrichment activities which enable them to apply their learning in real life contexts. Once all of the documents to support these developments are completed we will share our year group themes and schemes of learning via the curriculum.

Curriculum Enrichment

Reception and year 4 had a lovely trip to the Eden project on the last day of half term and were wonderfully behaved whilst out of school. Our last week of the half term was dedicated to outdoor learning. All our classes took part in a range of learning outside of the classroom. Key stage 2 also took part in a health and well-being day. Lots of our classes joined together for some joint learning activities.

Collective Worship

This term, our collective worship has a global theme. Our focus this week is on weather and natural disasters. Open the book enacted a story about Jesus and the children.

Engineering Project Competition

Last term all our pupils entered a STEM (Science, technology, engineering and maths) competition – 'If you were an engineer what would you do?' They had to come up with a design for something they would make if they were an engineer. The competition was a national one for Primary and Secondary pupils. We are thrilled that **Ella-May (Reception) has won a trophy for her design**. Also these are the children who were shortlisted and **awarded a distinction** for the Primary Engineering Award – **Samantha (Reception)**, **Lacey (Year1), Kalina (Year 2), Anna (Year 3), Jessica (Year 3), Yazmyn (Year 3), Daria (Year 4), Scarlett (Year 4), Aaron (Year 5), Millie M (Year 6) - their entries will also be on display at the exhibition. A staggering 3,469 entered this year, only 371 were shortlisted and reached the final round of judging and from these the 17 winners were chosen. To acknowledge this fantastic achievement, they will be displaying 234 of the shortlisted finalists at the public exhibition.**

<u>Attendance</u>

At present our whole school attendance is below national average. Whilst taking into account the illness that has been rife this year and recognising the strategies the school have put in place to raise this, Ofsted have set this as a school target for improvement. I will be meeting with the Education Welfare Office who is employed by county to ensure that the statutory requirement to attend school is met across Cornwall, to look at further strategies to improve attendance. Letters will be sent home to let parents know if their child's attendance is a concern. National expectations and average is at 96%. A child whose attendance is currently around 85% equates to having a whole half term off school so you can see the impact this would have on their learning and progress. We'd like to support all families to achieve the national expected. Please let us know if there is any support you'd like in improving attendance for your children.
