











#### **NUT FREE SCHOOL**



May we respectfully remind you that children are not allowed to bring any nuts or food with nuts (such as the chocolate spread with hazelnuts or the chocolate yoghurts that contain nuts) into school, for snack or lunch. We currently have several children with LIFE THREATENING ALLERGIES and even touching a table that has had nuts on or brushing up against someone who has been eating nuts can be enough to trigger a very severe reaction. #### **Reading in the Infants**

#### St Catherine's Early Reading

Following recent guidance from Ofsted, we will be changing how and when we change the children's reading books. Ofsted recommend that children read a text three times at home before moving on to a new book.

- The first time is to work on decoding and blending skills.
- ♣ The second time is for comprehension. Children should be encouraged to answer questions about what they are reading.
- The third time is to aid them in fluency of reading.

#### Changing books

**Manday** — all children will be given the RWI book bag book that links to the story that they are completing in RWI lessons this week. The green and red words in the book bag book are similar to the words being practiced in the class RWI book, thus improving fluency further.



Class book: The story being completed in RWI lessons for the week, starting on a Manday.



**Hame baok:** The corresponding story is sent home as the reading book.

Thursday – RWI home books are collected in. A new book will be issued using our own RWI banded system (stuck in the front of your child's reading diary). These books are not written by the WRI programme but will contain words that your child should be able to decode. These books will allow children to enjoy and explore different genres, styles and formats.

#### Year 2 readers who have completed the RWI programme

For Children in Year 2 who have completed the RWI programme, they will also have their books changed twice a week on Monday and Thursday. If your child is on a book band with a colour, then they are off the RWI system (for example: orange).

For shorter books, we would like the children to read them twice to aid fluency. For the larger books, we only expect them to read it once, before answering some comprehension questions.

For year 2 children who have left the RWI programme, we would like to see a parent comment in the reading diary stating they have answered some comprehension questions on the book before we change it.

#### Extra support with reading

If you would like extra help to support your child with early reading, then please visit the school website and look at the phonics page. There are videos to help with pronunciation of pure sounds and extra advice to support your child with reading at home.

It is <u>essential</u> that every book sent home is brought back <u>on time</u> to allow this system to work.
