School Improvement

Next week our year 4s will be taking part in a trial of the new multiplication tables check that the government will be implementing in the next academic year. The test is a short, online times table test. The government target is that pupils should know all their tables by year 4. The children's use of Times Table Rock Stars has really helped them to achieve this. Both of our maths online schemes and Spelling Shed are useful tools that the school has funded in order to support pupils develop these crucial English and maths skills. The children who are most improved/most committed and also those top of the times table Rockstar league, will be selected for Red Carpet week during which they get some special rewards for their efforts.

Curriculum Enrichment

Free Swimming Lessons -Swim Safe

Children and young people love swimming outdoors, but swimming in the sea, rivers and lakes is very different to swimming in a pool. Swim Safe is a fun, free opportunity for children aged between 7 and 14 (able to swim 25 metres) to learn how to keep themselves safe when swimming outdoors, and what to do if they get into trouble. From 29 July to 8 August, Monday to Thursday, children have the chance to take part in a fun, practical, interactive Swim Safe session at Summerleaze Beach, Bude and learn all about how to stay safe by the sea. Each hour-long session is completely FREE and includes safety advice from qualified lifequards and up to 30 minutes in-water tuition with qualified swimming teachers.
